Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to all our Riverbank families and a special warm welcome to those students and their families who are joining our school community. We hope you enjoy a long and happy association with our school. We take pride in setting high expectations of our students who are the very centre of our structured learning environment. Our Restorative Practice philosophy provides a framework for building strong relationships, effective communication, personal and social responsibility and a sense of belonging.

Education in a changing world has a vital role to play in preparing students for successful, enriched lives. At Riverbank Public School, students are challenged, yet nurtured and work both independently and in groups to solve authentic problems. Learning includes partnerships with industries in order to develop skills in students of innovation, fair testing and experimentation. Students accumulate a strong repertoire of general capabilities including literacy, numeracy, creative and critical thinking, intercultural understanding, ethical understanding, information and communication technologies and personal and social capability.

Students, staff, parents and community members are encouraged to participate in all aspects of school life. Parents are valued as true partners in the education of their children, contributing their initiative, energy, time and expertise to the school. At Riverbank, all students have the opportunity to attain knowledge, skills, values and attitudes enabling them to be reflective, self-sufficient and self-motivated lifelong learners.

This year we have formed 64 mainstream classes and 3 support classes for students with special needs.

The first few days of a new school year are always a little hectic; as students learn new routines and parents are keen to find out what class their children are in and where they line up. I have been very impressed with how settled the students have been in their new classrooms.

Our main entry gate will be open from 8am to 9am and then from 2pm to 3pm. During 9am and 2pm, there is an intercom at the main entry for parents to access the school. The High School now have their own gates on Wentworth Street, located near their car park.

Before and After School care will now have their own gates from 6.30am to 8.15am and then from 2.45pm to 6.30pm. This gate is the entrance the school used in 2019.

A list with class names, teachers and a school map will be included in next week's school newsletter and will be placed on our website and school app this week. Our 2020 School Information Booklet is now available on our school website.

2020 school invoices will be sent out each term. The Term 1 invoice has been included in the welcome pack.

All students have a wonderful opportunity to participate in weekly Chess, Dance, Choir, Band, Music, Music tuition, Drama, ICT, Debating and PSSA sport programs. An overview of paid after school activities will be sent out on the school app this week.

I have included in the welcome pack our 2020 Term 1 Calendar, which highlights key events throughout the term. Dates may sometimes vary, and new events will be added. The calendar is available on the school's website.

Meet the Teacher information evening sessions will be held during weeks 2 & 3 and week 5 for Kindergarten. All sessions will commence in the school hall and these sessions are for parents only. Individual student learning will be discussed at parent - teacher interviews in Week 10.

Newsletters are published during even weeks and updates are sent out through our school app. Our Facebook page celebrates our weekly achievements.

Late Drop off and Early Pick Up - If you are picking up your child early, you must go to the school office and sign them out before you collect your child from the classroom. If a student is late coming to school, you must sign them in at the front office before they go to class. Students cannot sign themselves in or out of school.

The school's Kiss and Ride area is within the "No Parking" zones and are located on Wentworth Street and Riverbank Drive. You are only allowed to stop your vehicle to set down or pick up passengers and must not stop for more than 2 minutes. The driver must not be more than 3 metres from the vehicle. Highway patrol will be regularly patrolling our perimeter. Thank you for ensuring the safety of all of our students when entering and leaving the premises.

At Riverbank, we value open communication channels in our school. You are more than welcome to make an appointment to meet with me by contacting the School Administration Staff. Alternatively, I am in the playground most mornings and afternoons and I always welcome feedback.

Over the year, your child will be involved in a varied and challenging program which will encourage them to work to their full potential in many different activities and learning experiences. Emphasis on social skills, communication, independence and cooperation is important to achieve a happy and active learning environment. Your child's teacher is _____ in class _____.

School times from 8:45am to 2:45pm

Children are not to be at school before 8:15am. Upon arriving at school, children are to leave their bags at their designated space as set by their class teacher. Students who have siblings in the high school will be supervised in the area near the staffroom until collected at 3pm by their sibling.

Meet the Teacher Night

The Stage 2 Meet the Teacher information session is being held on Wednesday 5 February. Our evening will commence at 6pm in the school hall with a presentation from the Stage 2 teachers. This is a great opportunity for you to find out more about our routines and the fabulous programs we are offering our students. After the presentation you will have the opportunity to visit the classroom with the evening concluding at 7pm.

Labelling

Please ensure that all items of clothing, including school bags, food containers and drink bottles are clearly labelled with your child's name. This will ensure that 'missing' items are returned to the rightful owner.

Book Covers

Thank you in advance for covering your child's books. Books will be sent home during the first couple of weeks to be covered with either plastic or contact. Please return your child's books to school the following day.

Code of Behaviour

The HIP (Help Increase the Peace) program offers a whole school approach to building relationships through communication, cooperation, trust building and conflict resolution.

Our School Values are:

1. We share the voice space by listening quietly.
2. We follow instructions:
 - a. *in the right place*
 - b. *at the right time*
 - c. *doing the right thing*
3. We use build ups by saying nice things.
4. We keep our hands, feet and objects to ourselves.

Homework

Homework will be **sent home each Friday and returned the following Thursday**. The activities that are sent home for homework are to revise the English and Maths skills taught in class. If you have concerns regarding homework please do not hesitate to meet with your classroom teacher. At different times during the year there are also small assignments set linked to our units of work. Students will be given a set time in order to complete these assignments. Homework will commence in Week 3.

Additional Learning Needs

Some children have special or additional needs. If your child has an identified learning or other need, please advise the school early so that a plan can be put into place. Each plan will be different, so it is important to provide us with as much information as possible so that we have a comprehensive understanding of your child's needs.

Curriculum

English - Our students will be developing their reading, comprehension strategies and writing skills through modelled, guided and independent teaching and learning. This term, Year 3 students will learn about the structure and features of persuasive and narrative texts through our themes of Sustainability and Fractured Fairy Tales. Year 4 students will learn about Characterisation. Handwriting, grammar, and phonemic awareness are all elements of English that will also be integrated. Spelling will continue to be supported through the use of Sound Waves. Our students will again be participating in the Riverbank Public Speaking Competition where they will continue to develop their speaking and listening skills.

Mathematics - Learning will take place across three content strands: Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability. This term, our curriculum will focus on:

History – The semester one unit is First Contacts. This topic introduces world history and the movements of peoples. Beginning with the history of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, students examine European exploration and colonisation in Australia and throughout the world up to the early 1800s.

PDHPE - Students participate in primary sport every Friday morning. Physical education lessons on Tuesdays will focus on the development of game skills, fitness and fundamental movement skills. Children will be required to wear sports uniform on both of these days.

Science and Technology - During Term 1, Stage 2 students are studying the unit 'Material World'. They will investigate the properties of materials and how they change state under different conditions. Students will also be attending STEAM classes with Mrs Seward. Lessons will build on content and skills taught last year.

Assemblies

Stage 2 Assemblies will be held on alternate Friday afternoons after lunch at 1:45pm. Year 3 commences on Friday 28 February (odd weeks) and Year 4 on Friday 5 March (even weeks). Parents will be notified when their child's class will perform their assembly item and if possible are encouraged to attend. These dates are also published in the school newsletter.

Allergies

If you have any concerns with your child's allergies or other medical conditions, please contact the school office. We try to avoid all peanut products in the classroom. We thank you for your cooperation and ask that children not share food at school.

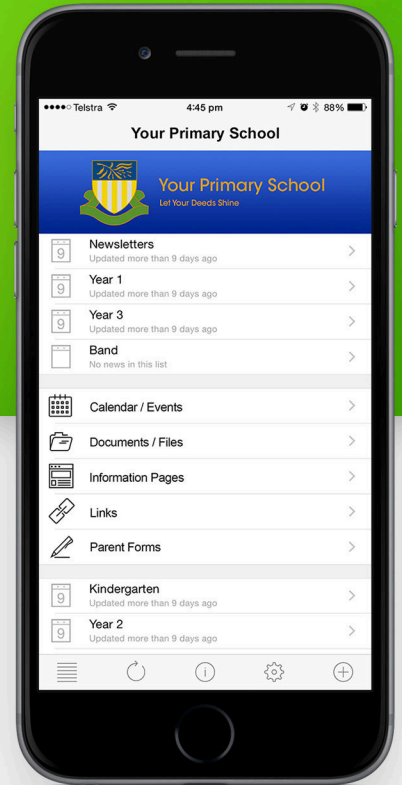

The Riverbank Public School Swimming Carnival will go ahead on **Monday 10 February 2020**, regardless of weather, for students in Years 3-6 and Yr 2 students turning 8 this year who can confidently swim 50 metres.

| Venue | Riverstone Swimming Centre – Market Street, Riverstone. Water depth ranges from 1.8m near the starting blocks to 1.2m at the shallow end. |
| Cost | \$12 per child - covers the bus and pool entry fee (no refunds will be given) |
| Transport | All students are required to travel by bus from school to the carnival. Buses will leave from the school at 9.00am and will return before 2.45pm. Students are permitted to go home with their parents at the completion of the carnival once they have been signed off the roll. If you wish to take someone else's child home, written permission must be provided by the child's parent. |
| Conditions | Once children have been signed out at the completion of the carnival it will be the parent's responsibility to supervise their child. If parents intend to remain at the pool you must pay a re-entry fee of approximately \$4.60 for your child as the school payment only covers the carnival/bus fee. Please respect the pool centre's position on this condition. |
| Seating | Children who are not competing in races must remain in the shaded area at the poolside. There is a flat, tree shaded area at the entrance end of the pool if parents wish to set up chairs and umbrellas. Students need to sit with their 'house' and support the competitors. |
| Supervision | All primary staff will attend the carnival. Two certified lifesavers from the centre will be on duty in addition to supervising teachers. |
| Uniform | Students wear full sports uniform, with a shirt in their house colour if they choose. Students are encouraged to wear their swimming costume (if competing) under their uniform or they can change at the pool. No crepe paper streamers are allowed. |
| Please bring | Your child will need to bring the following in a bag: Swimmers (if competing), towel, hat, sunscreen , lunch, recess and drinks. Drinks and snack foods are available at the kiosk (maximum of \$5 spending money). As this is an outdoor venue, it is recommended that students bring adequate sun protection, eg SPF50+ Broad spectrum, water resistant sunscreen. |
