Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to all our Riverbank families and a special warm welcome to those students and their families who are joining our school community. We hope you enjoy a long and happy association with our school. We take pride in setting high expectations of our students who are the very centre of our structured learning environment. Our Restorative Practice philosophy provides a framework for building strong relationships, effective communication, personal and social responsibility and a sense of belonging.

Education in a changing world has a vital role to play in preparing students for successful, enriched lives. At Riverbank Public School, students are challenged, yet nurtured and work both independently and in groups to solve authentic problems. Learning includes partnerships with industries in order to develop skills in students of innovation, fair testing and experimentation. Students accumulate a strong repertoire of general capabilities including literacy, numeracy, creative and critical thinking, intercultural understanding, ethical understanding, information and communication technologies as well as personal and social responsibilities.

Students, staff, parents and community members are encouraged to participate in all aspects of school life. Parents are valued as true partners in the education of their children, contributing their initiative, energy, time and expertise to the school. At Riverbank, all students have the opportunity to attain knowledge, skills, values and attitudes enabling them to be reflective, self-sufficient and self-motivated lifelong learners.

This year we have formed 74 mainstream classes and 3 support classes for students with special needs.

- 11 Early Stage 1 Kindergarten
- 23 Stage 1 Years 1 and 2
- 21 Stage 2 Years 3 and 4
- 19 Stage 3 Years 5 and 6

The first few days of a new school year are always a little hectic; as students learn new routines and parents are keen to find out what class their children are in and where they line up. I have been very impressed with how settled the students have been in their new classrooms.

Our main entry gate will be open from 8.15am to 8.45am and then from 2.45pm to 3pm. During 8.45am and 2.45pm, there is an intercom at the main entry for parents to access the school. The High School have their own gates on Wentworth Street, located near their car park. After consultation with the P&C and in line with current COVID guidelines, we are continuing with no parents on site in the morning, with students to be dropped off at our school gates. Parents are welcome on school grounds of an afternoon to collect their child.

Kindergarten parents will be welcome on site in the mornings for the first week (Monday 1 to Friday 5 February). From Monday 8 February, Year 6 students will support Kindergarten walking to their classrooms from the school gates.

We request parents leave the school grounds promptly after dropping or picking up their child.

Before and After school care have their own gates on Wentworth Street from 6.30am to 8.15am and then from 2.45pm to 6.30pm

A list with class names, teachers and a school map will be included in next week's school newsletter and will be placed on our website and school app. Our 2021 School Information Booklet is now available on our school website.

2021 school invoices will be sent out each term. The Term 1 invoice has been included in the welcome pack.

All students have a wonderful opportunity to participate in weekly Chess, Dance, Choir, Band, Music, Music tuition, Drama, ICT, Debating and PSSA sport programs. An overview of paid after school activities will be sent out on the school app next week.

I have included in the welcome pack our 2021 Term 1 Calendar, which highlights key events throughout the term. Dates may sometimes vary, and new events will be added. The calendar is available on the school's website. This year we have a parent engagement calendar which highlights key events and workshops.

Meet the Teacher information evening sessions will be held during weeks 3, 4 and week 5. These sessions will be held online. We have scheduled a classroom visit time for parents to come on site and meet their teacher in person. More information will be sent home regarding meet the teacher sessions. Individual student learning will be discussed at parent - teacher interviews in Week 9. Parents are welcome to make a time to meet with their teacher either over the phone or a meeting after school. Please email the school to request an appointment after the online information sessions.

Newsletters are published during even weeks and regular updates are sent out through our school app. Our Facebook page celebrates our weekly achievements.

Late Drop off and Early Pick Up - If you are picking up your child early, you must go to the school office and sign them out before you collect your child from the classroom. If a student is late arriving to school, you must sign them in at the front office before they go to class. Students cannot sign themselves in or out of school.

The school's Kiss and Ride area is within the "No Parking" zones and are located on Wentworth Street and Riverbank Drive. You are only allowed to stop your vehicle to set down or pick up passengers and must not stop for more than 2 minutes. The driver must not be more than 3 metres from the vehicle. Highway patrol will be regularly patrolling our perimeter. Thank you for ensuring the safety of all of our students when entering and leaving the premises.

At Riverbank, we value open communication channels in our school. You are more than welcome to make an appointment to meet with me by contacting the School Administration Staff. Alternatively, I am in the playground or on front gate duty most mornings and afternoons and I always welcome feedback.

Curriculum

English

Reading, Writing, Speaking & Listening - Our students will develop their reading, comprehension strategies and writing skills through modelled, guided and independent teaching and learning. Students will explore specific aspects of texts that enhance enjoyment. They will learn that texts are a way into the world of the imagination and can be enjoyed many times. Handwriting, grammar, phonics and phonemic awareness are all elements of English that will be integrated into students learning. Spelling will be supported through the use of Sound Waves.

PDHPE

Sport and Fitness - Students will be required to wear their sports uniform on Mondays and Thursdays. During these sessions, students will focus on developing fundamental movement skills such as catching, throwing, kicking and hitting a ball that can be used in team sports. Students will also be learning how to play a variety of team sports and games.

Health - Students will be learning how they can be inclusive and respectful. They will describe and practise ways to develop caring and respectful relationships through our Restorative Practice framework and bullying unit.

<u>History</u> - The topic 'Family Past and Present' provides a study of the history of their local area, examining the remains of the past and why they should be preserved.

Creative and Practical Arts

This term the Creative and Practical Arts program integrates music, drama, visual arts and dance. Students will have the opportunity to explore and create different art forms related to the Indigenous Culture and our English units of work.

Science and Technology

Science - the topic 'Physical World' focusing the different forms of energy around us and how can we detect them.

Technology - will be integrated into all key learning areas through the use of iPads, laptops, desktops and interactive screens. Students will also use robots, virtual and augmented reality and holograms to enhance their learning experiences.

STEAM – is an educational approach to learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics to guide student inquiry, conversation, and critical thinking. The program will encourage students to take thoughtful risks, engage in experiential learning, persist in problem-solving, embrace collaboration, and work through the creative and designing process. Students in Stage 1 will use innovative technology, complete investigations and become confident problem solvers through their learning experiences.

Homework

Homework will commence in Week 3. It will be sent home each Friday and returned on the following Thursday. The activities that are sent home are to revise the English and Mathematics skills taught in class. At different times during the year there will also be small assignments set, usually based on History or Science topics. Students will be given a set time to complete these assignments. It is expected that all homework be completed by the student and supervised by a parent. If you have concerns regarding homework please do not hesitate to come and meet with your child's classroom teacher.

Home Readers

Shortly your child will start our home reading program. A letter will be sent home with details regarding this program. Please encourage home reading as much as possible - both silent reading and listening to your child read out aloud. Even the best readers come across words that are unfamiliar to them. This will be a great way to prepare them for home reading!

Literacy at home

- Talk about experiences at home ask questions
- Read with them as often as possible
- Use the school or local library to borrow Literacy resources
- Be an interested listener
- Practise spelling with your child as often as possible, praise every effort made
- Read to and with your child as often as possible

Numeracy at home

- When measuring ingredients, or shopping, mention weights, capacities etc. Identify shapes in the home
- Help children to learn the time analog and digital and converting between the two
- Solve problems which require children to work mathematically
- Create shopping lists together, estimate total costs and work out how much money is needed or how much change is received

Additional Learning Needs

Some children have special or additional needs. If your child has an identified learning or other need, please advise the school early so that a plan can be put into place. As each plan is different, it is important to provide us with as much information as possible so that we can have a comprehensive understanding of your child's needs.

Assemblies

Our Stage 1 assemblies will be held on Friday afternoons at 12.45pm, with Year 1 assembly being held during odd weeks and Year 2 assembly being held during even weeks. Assemblies will begin in Week 5, starting with Year 1. These dates are published in the school newsletter.

Allergies

If you have any concerns with your child's allergies or other medical conditions, please contact the school office as soon as possible. We try to avoid all peanut products in the classroom. We thank you for your cooperation and ask that children not share food at school.

Birthdays

Birthdays are special occasions for children. The canteen has recently added 'Birthday Buckets' which can purchased at least 24 hours in advance via the canteen app. If your child wishes, they may bring cupcakes for the class on their birthday.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's progress, please do not hesitate to contact the school to arrange a time for a meeting with their classroom teacher.

General Statement

"Seesaw" is an online tool used at Riverbank Public School to create a personalised learning journal for each student. It captures aspects of a students' learning progress that happen throughout the school year. It gives students a voice, makes their thinking visible and encourages self-reflection and ownership of their education. Seesaw empowers students to independently document what they are learning. This app supports the development capabilities in communication, collaboration, creative thinking, problem solving, digital Literacy and citizenship. It strengthens the link between home and school and provides students with an authentic audience, as parents are able to access the app to keep up to date with class events, activities and learning. Seesaw's platform allows families to celebrate their child's learning development, progress and achievements, as they occur.

How will Seesaw be used at Riverbank Public School?

Teachers and students K-2 will use school iPads to post work samples, photos, videos and voice recordings to personalised student portfolios. Students will only begin to use Seesaw after written consent is received from the parent/carer. The frequency and content of students' work posted, will occur consistently across each grade and depend on year level and curriculum. Parents/carers will be able to see their child's work throughout the year and comment on their progress. Students will also have the opportunity to share and discuss their portfolio with their parent/carer through events organised at school. At the end of the school year parents/carers will have a limited time to download a copy of their child's learning journal.

Parent Posting Expectations

- Parents and Carers can like posts and comment on their child's portfolio.
- Parents and Carers comments are to be approved by the teacher.
- Parents and Carers comments are to celebrate and acknowledge student learning.
- Parents and Carers are not to use the images/videos for any other use.
- Parents and Carers will use this platform to increase involvement in their child's learning.
- Parents and Carers are encouraged to ask questions that show interest in their child's learning, providing opportunities to reflect and connect together using the Seesaw portfolio.
- Parents and Carers are encouraged to give positive feedback and praise. Examples of what
 this includes are praise or feedback for effort, progress, resilience, consistency, creativity and
 presentation.
- Parents and Carers must use the communication of this platform only to support and celebrate student learning.
- Direct communication with teachers is to go through the school email or teacher's email.
