The Partners in Learning parent feedback survey

Thank you to all the members of the community who took the time to complete the survey. The survey window is now closed. The survey will assist the school to better understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Information Evening

As mentioned in earlier newsletters, Riverbank is investigating the idea of BYOD for Stage 3 only in 2017. An information night will be held at the The Ponds High School on Thursday, November 24th at 6.00pm. The meeting will take place in the The Ponds High School Hall and will outline the BYOD policy, specifications of the hardware, our preferred provider, warranty information, price points and how to purchase laptops using our preferred provider's portal. We have had conversations with our preferred provider regarding warranties, provisions of replacement machines and the selection of machines. Next year's Stage 3 (Years 5 & 6) are invited to attend the evening to learn more about the BYOD program next year.

Arrival and Departure Times

The official start time for Riverbank Public School is 8:30am, but recently some students have been arriving at school from 7:50am. There is no supervision provided until 8:30am and any student who continues to arrive at school too early will be directed to OOSH (Out Of School Hours) at the parent's expense. Those students who have siblings attending the High School are reminded if they do arrive at school early due to High School starting times, the older child must remain with their younger sibling/s until 8:15am. School finishes at 3:00pm and it is expected that students are to be picked up at this time. Any student who is continually collected late will be directed to OOSH at the parent's expense. If due to unforeseen circumstances, you are running late a phone call to the school would be greatly appreciated.

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Entering and Leaving the School

Due to the installation of classrooms in Riverbank's School Carpark, staff from Riverbank Public School are now using the High School Carpark, located on Wentworth Street. For safety reasons parents are NOT permitted to use this carpark for ANY reason, except those who have sought special permission from the school. Please DO NOT use the carpark has a thoroughfare to enter or leave the school or drop students off in the morning and pick-up students in the afternoon. This will be closely monitored to ensure the safety of the students at Riverbank Public School.

Our final Book Fair for the year will be held from Monday 31st October until Friday 4th November (Week 4). Opening hours for purchases are:



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Riverbank Public School – School Master Planning Consultation

The NSW Department of Education has commenced early site investigations and master planning for a proposed expansion of Riverbank Public School. The project will focus on the expansion of the school's existing state-of-the-art facilities to provide additional capacity and cater for the growing student population in the catchment area.

While the project is not yet funded, the Department is planning for the school's long term future to ensure the best possible learning environment for students.

In September 2016, Cadence as Project Managers on behalf of the Department of Education conducted consultation with the local school community to seek input for the school masterplan.

A survey was made available to all members of the school community through information booths at the school and the school newsletter. The survey sought insight and first-hand knowledge of the school facilities, as well as input and ideas on the future vision for the school.

Survey results summary

The features and facilities seen as most important at Riverbank Public School in order are:

- Classroom and teaching facilities
- Ovals and outdoor space
- Play space
- Shade
- · Landscaping, gardens and trees
- Flexible learning spaces
- Contemporary facilities

The top five new or additional facilities respondents felt the school will benefit most from were:

- Shade structures
- More flexible classrooms and teaching spaces
- Outdoor play spaces appropriate for different age groups
- More trees, landscaping and gardening
- More outdoor teaching and learning space

The top five factors respondents felt were most important in the design process were:

- Learning needs
- Outdoor space
- Flexibility
- Creating a community
- Sustainability

Next steps and more information

The results of the survey have been provided to the design team. This information will be considered, along with technical data and best practice standards for school development to prepare concept designs for the masterplan.

Masterplan concept designs that meet the Department's strict approval standards will be presented to the school community for feedback. We will keep you updated via the school newsletter and regular information booths being held at the school.



School Student Transport Scheme Applications open 10 October 2016

From Monday 10 October 2016 parents, guardians and students over 16 years, will be able to apply for 2017 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel pass by visiting www.transportrsw.info/school-students

Information for parents and students

School travel passes only need to be updated when a student:

- · changes address, or
- · changes school or campus.

A new application is required when:

- · applying for an SSTS pass for the first time,
- · enrolling in Kindergarten,
- progressing from Year 2 to Year 3,
- · progressing from Year 6 to Year 7, or
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation.

Passes for 2017 travel

Opal network: Please remind ALL your students to keep their School Opal cards for travel in 2017. These cards will be automatically deactivated for school holidays and then reactivated for school travel in term one. Current School Opal card can be updated with changes of school, home address or operator.

Rural and regional travel: Student's travelling with operator issued passes will receive a new pass in the new school year.
