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## REPORT FROM OUR DEPUTY PRINCIPALS

### Tell Them from Me Surveys

Our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell them from me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students in Years 4-6 participated in a Tell Them From Me student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and timely feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are at school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell them from me survey to help improve how they do things at school.

We would like to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 27 August and 26 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

Our school will also be participating in the Partners in Learning parent survey, another part of the Tell Them From Me suite of surveys on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement. Running this survey will help our school understand parents and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between late August and October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated. 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## Restorative Practices

Restorative Practices form the relational basis for Quality Teaching and Learning at Riverbank Public School. Our Restorative Practice Framework, because of its explicit nature, offers a common language and practice capable of fostering healthy relationships.

Student achievement is enhanced through Restorative values being embedded as a way of being and learning together. Our approach fosters individual responsibility and helps develop empathy. Inappropriate behaviour or choices and mistakes can be viewed as an opportunity for insight, learning and development in both the academic and social domains.

The explicit framework is inextricably linked to the Quality Teaching Framework and includes the following sets of questions to be asked by children, teachers and parents.

### When Things Go Wrong.....When Someone Has Been Hurt

- What happened?
- What were you thinking of at the time?
- What have you thought about since?
- Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?
- What do you think you may do to make things right?
- What did you think when you realised what happened?
- What impact has this incident had on you and others?
- What has been the hardest thing for you?
- What do you think needs to happen to make things right?

The process is empowering as it takes students from the past to the present and gives them hope for the future. It empowers them to make things right and heal any harm that has been done.

A restorative classroom setting is one that values dialogue through an inclusive approach where everyone expects to be heard and through this participatory process, students develop the capacity to learn that emotions are an important and legitimate expression of healthy dialogue. This process helps students to deal with conflict, tensions and difference in respectful ways that engender trust and foster healthy relationships.

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## School Motto

The school's motto, 'Learning to Live, Living to Learn', reinforces a broad and enriching curriculum, which not only focuses on the development of literacy and numeracy skills but also on the social and emotional wellbeing of the students whilst respecting a culturally diverse community.

# Science Week 2018

## GAME CHANGERS and CHANGE MAKERS

On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August, Riverbank students were engaged in activities that supported the 2018 National Science Week theme, 'Game Changers and Change Makers'. Our teacher led activities encouraged an interest in science and fascinated students by the world in which we live. The activities and theme for Science Week provided an opportunity to acknowledge the contributions of scientists, engineers, technologists, mathematicians, designers and innovators, both past and present, to our world.



### Stage 3

The activities undertaken by our seniors required collaboration, creative design and construction skills in order to implement a successful solution that had to meet the specified requirements. Students cooperated to create rockets, catapults, rockets, gliders and parachutes as well as investigated static electricity.

### Early Stage 1

With science passports firmly grasped in hands, Kindergarten worked their way through five different experiments. Students marvelled as the colours of skittles moved across the water, 'ooh'-ed as ingredients combined to create fluffy slime, 'aah'-ed over chemical reactions with fizzing colours, were shocked by static electricity and creatively constructed boats.

### Stage 1

All students completed five examinations of differing science concepts. In a jar, they added food colouring to shaving cream to replicate clouds in a storm. Surface tension was examined with milk, detergent and food colouring. Optical illusions were created via the creation of thaumatropes. Students also delved into how the purpose and design effects the construction of some vehicles such as how boats can carry large loads and plane design effects movement through the air.

### Stage 2

Throughout the day, students moved through a variety of diverse hands-on experiments. Some required students to engage their inner architect by constructing stable structures such as bridges, towers, boats and marble runs. In other activities, students examined and discussed the results when mixing together various ingredients such as cornflour with water and milk with oil. Whilst other experiments investigated items that we take for granted such as the telephone.

Additionally, Year 4 students were lucky to observe a demonstration involving liquid nitrogen from Fizzics Education. The audience were amazed at the effects this extremely cold liquid had on everyday objects.

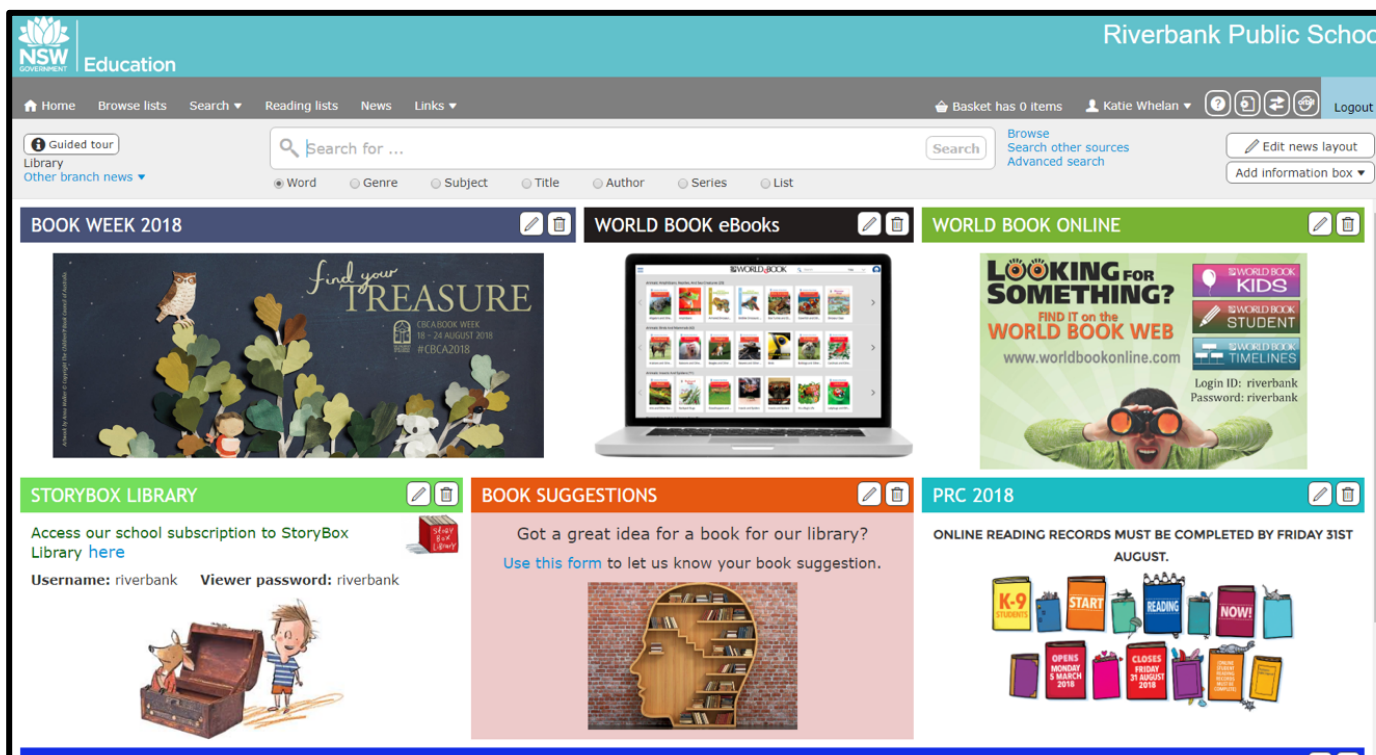

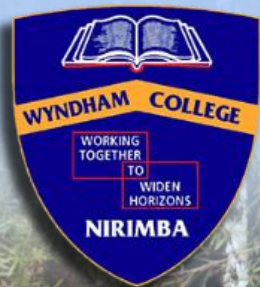
